

Tenants Project Fund – Panel 1 Approved Projects

Organisation	Amount Requested	Brief Summary
Police & Groundwork	£7500	Create a community gardening area near Lostock gardens with raised beds/allotments on an area of land that is currently owned by BCH and has been gated. The project is supported by Groundwork.
LANPAC	£1000	They plan to organise a 12 week programme of self defence/jiu jitsu classes for 20 (10 from each ward) young people residing on Lune Grove and Jeffrey Square in Blackpool in conjunction with The Musubi Martial Arts club on Woodland Grove. The programme will consist of 2 free taster sessions followed by a further 10 funded sessions.
Environmental Protection	£6370	<p>To purchase a portable CCTV system that can be linked into 3 separate already existing pieces of portable noise monitoring equipment i.e. Norsonic 140. Existing noise monitoring equipment currently used in Grange Park, Queens Park, and Mereside Housing Estates: the device is set up to record incidents of ASB in relation to Noise Nuisance.</p> <p>Provision of the Nor-140/ VID would enable the already existing noise equipment to be linked with a visual footage system, enabling evidence to be captured in relation to ASB incidents – useful for the BCH ASB team with dealing with problematic properties/persons.</p>
LANPAC	£3998	To establish a Youth Club at Whiteholme Community Centre on All Saints Road. The club will be aimed at young people between the ages of 13 to 18 and will offer them a positive place to meet as there is currently a lack of facilities. They aim to run sessions for young people at the club throughout the year on Friday nights between the hours of 19:30 to 21:30hrs when most ASB occurs.
Park Ward Councillors	£10000	<p>Blackpool Council is developing 14 new family homes on the Grange Park Estate. The site where these new homes are being built includes Gateside Park. As part of the regeneration, it is planned to bring the park back to life (it consists of traditional play equipment considered outdated and in poor condition) and compliment the new housing development.</p> <p>Blackpool Council has successfully secured the funding for the housing development and for most of the park regeneration but it is £12,000 short. They would like the TPF to fund £10,000 towards buying new modern play equipment for the park. It will include a range of facilities that appeal to all member of the local community and will be keeping with the newly developed houses</p>
